

PRO SKILLS BASKETBALL (PSB) CLUB TEAMS OVERVIEW

Mission:

To prepare players for the next level of their basketball careers, whether that be elementary, middle, high school, or college while simultaneously teaching them life lessons through competitive basketball.

Life Lessons (F.O.C.U.S.):

• Fun

This is first for a reason! Basketball is a GAME. It is meant to fun. Often times competitive youth basketball can suck the fun out of the game whether due to pressure, parents, coaches, etc. Our goal is to always make sure that the game remains fun. This is not to say that there won't be some "tough" times (see the "O" below), but overall, playing youth basketball should be fun!

Overcome

The ability to overcome obstacles and not give up when a challenge presents itself is an extremely difficult trait to master. In youth basketball, obstacles arise in different forms like a simple turnover or missed shot, losing, bad refs, lack of playing time, etc. We teach our players to focus on the things they can control, like their attitude and effort, instead of focusing on the obstacles they cannot.

Compete

 Learning to compete and work/fight for what you want, instead of expecting to be given it, is a major challenge facing youth today. Our players must be tough and aggressive in order to earn playing time and win games. Unity

A two-pronged value, including coachability and teamwork, unity goes a long on the court and off. Coachability means players must learn how to take correction from the coach as well as remain humble after praise. Teamwork means working with others to achieve a common goal. Players must learn to work well with all of their teammates as well as accept and do the best they can in their team roles in order to win games.

Sacrifice

 The good old-fashioned value of hard work can never be underestimated. Rarely do good things come without a lot of hard work, and hard work requires sacrifice. Players must learn that in order to achieve their goals and dreams, they will be required to make short-term sacrifices for long-term success.

Who/What We Are NOT:

We are NOT a cut-throat, win-at-all-costs club. We are not interested in traveling the US trying to win national championships in elementary and middle school. We do not try to recruit the best kids in the state, roll the ball out, and say "ok, now just go play". We do not and will not sacrifice our values and beliefs for any one player, parent, coach or even team.

On the other end of the spectrum, we are NOT a recreational, everybody-plays-equal-and-gets-a-trophy, "daddy ball" club. We give all players a chance to play in games and perform, but we play to compete and win. The players that the coach feels gives the team the best chance to do that will play more than the others.

If there is some sort of mid-point between these two opposing spectrums, that is where we try to be and that is who we are.

Cost:

We recognize that competitive basketball is an investment in your child's development. Each year, PSB-trained players graduate to play for collegiate programs. We are the best at what we do and have chosen to do this for a living, so no decision, including player fees, is taken lightly and without much consideration.

 - \$205/month or \$1,025 total
 - 5 months: March-July
 - 7-8 tournaments with "Nationals" option to finish
 - 3 hours of practice/week
- High School (9th-11th grade)
 - \$220/month or \$1,100 total
 - 5 months: March-July (2-3 weeks "off" end of June for HS bball)
 - Recruiting service & help
 - 7-8 tournaments
 - Includes **all** NCAA "live" period tourneys unless designated as "local" team

 - Based off the "free/reduced price" school lunch program
 - Must apply BEFORE teams are made
 - Need official letter from school & completed PSB financial aid application
